Deadline

Applications must be received in their entirety by 2:30 PM on Friday, 5 January 2018.

Scholarship Information

Students invited to participate in the **Distinguished Scholars Program** will be awarded an academic scholarship. The amount of this scholarship will be determined by entrance exam results and seventh/eighth grade academic achievement. If awarded a scholarship, students will be expected to maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher with no grades below 80 while at Notre Dame. Failure to do so may result in the revocation of any scholarship. In addition, students will be expected to fully participate in the **Distinguished Scholars Program** to continue to receive their academic scholarship. Families may also qualify for need-based financial aid.
